## REPETITIVE SCHEDULED NON-EMERGENT AMBULANCE TRANSPORT

### SKILLED NURSING FACILITY

As the ordering physician/practitioner, you are required to supply the ambulance supplier or beneficiary a Physician Certification Statement (PCS) as well as any other documentation that supports medical necessity. **Note:** If you are *not* the ordering physician, you are still *required* to provide medical documentation that will *support* the need for stretcher transport. ### AMBULANCE SUPPLIER

Before furnishing the service to the beneficiary, you must obtain a Physician Certification Statement (PCS) from the beneficiary's ordering physician/practitioner certifying the medical necessity requirements were met. Click [here](#) for more!

Medicare may cover repetitive, scheduled, non-emergent transportation by ambulance. A repetitive ambulance service is a medically necessary ambulance transportation that is provided three or more times during a 10-day period; or at least once per week for at least three weeks.
